As the club's reporting year comes to a close, I would like firstly to offer my thanks to the members of our committee and sub-committees for the time and effort they have donated to the club during the past twelve months. I am a little disappointed again this year that more members have not involved themselves with the administration activities of our club – the result being that many responsibilities fall to the shoulders of a few when they could so easily be shared. On the plus side however, I am delighted to see that last year's committee have again stood for positions this year – the result of this being that the club will continue to be served by a unified, hard working group of people who manage to get things done in a very efficient and pleasant manner. Thank you for your ongoing support – you make my job as President a very easy one!

Our club has over the years established a reputation of being pro-active in many canine related areas and the following activities undertaken during the past year have ensured this reputation will continue:

- Provision of financial support to ensure the Border Collie Rescue service remains active

- Donation of funds to the Battens Disease Foundation to assist in ongoing research into this disease in children

- Hosting two club shows/trials providing members with the opportunity to compete in conformation, obedience, agility and jumping competitions
- Conducting a Tracking Trial
- Maintenance of a website which provides Border Collie related information to club members and the general public
- Production of a regular newsletter to keep members informed on all club and breed related matters

I have enjoyed this past term as club President and if re-elected for the 2008-09 year will endeavour to ensure that the club remains active in a variety of areas and continues to serve the needs of its members and promote responsible breeding, training and ownership of our wonderful breed.

The NSWBCC Inc in the 2007/2008 year had a total membership of 199 members. Our renewals as of the 8/9/08 are 131.

Annual Treasurers Report

The 2007/08 period has proved to be a successful year for the club from a financial basis. Over the 12 months the club made a profit of almost \$1,300. The most significant items during the year where:-

- The club membership income increased from \$3,663.85 in 2006/07 to \$4,740.00 in the previous 12 months. This came from a membership drive which the club undertook at the start of last financial year and reverses a trend from a number of the previous years where membership income was falling. Hopefully we will be able to keep all of these members for the upcoming year.
- Newsletter costs down from \$4,036.18 in the 2006/07 year to \$2,285.48. This was the biggest impact on the clubs balance sheet with over 100 members taking the opportunity to receive the clubs newsletter via email instead by post.
- General postage costs for the 2007/08 year where up from \$130.15 to \$460.41 due to the additional postage and stationery that was used when letters where sent to people trying to attract new members. This additional cost was offset by the additional income generated by the additional members.

The strong financial position of the club allowed the club to support a number of outside community organisations such as the Battens Disease Foundation and also the NSW Border Collie rescue. It also meant that the club could offer special cash prizes for our members at our March show and we will continue to do this for the same show next year.

I thank all members and fellow executive members for their support during the previous year and I would like to encourage other club members to consider helping out with a committee position or a show/trial managers' position in the upcoming 12 months.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

The club has recently undertaken, as a community project, to provide twenty primary schools in western Sydney with two copies each of a delightful picture book which we hope will help children learn to interact with dogs in a positive and safe manner. The book "Can I Pat That Dog", is written, researched and illustrated by Australians, Susan McLaine, Karen Damiani and Margaret Power.

Thanks to the help of committee members, Julia Lawrie and Ann Lenehan, we were able to source the books at a discounted price. A sticker label confirming the donation by our club and providing our web address was placed on the inside cover.

For those not familiar with this book, a brief description follows:

Dogs are often called 'man's best friend' but, just like people, most dogs are not happy all the time. All sorts of dogs may growl, bark or sometimes bite when they are angry or frightened. With the aid of this book, parents and teachers can help children understand how to interpret a dog's body language and increase children's awareness for personal safety around dogs.

About the authors:

Susan McLaine is an education officer at Dromkeen Children's Literature Centre in Victoria.

Karen Damiani is a qualified dog trainer and lectures on dog behaviour and training throughout Australia.

Margaret Power has illustrated over 50 books and is one of Australia's most respected childrens book illustrators.
