The final results are published below – congratulations to all the winners!



Meet Your Committee...

Julia Lawrie – Agility Trial Manager & Ann Lenehan – General Committee

Ann and Julia's Story by Jemmie



Their lives have always intertwined with the world of canines. In ancient times when they were pups their world was less knowledgeable than present. In those far off times, all they knew about canines was what they observed, heard and what the elders told them.

Dogs were exactly that. Submissive creatures who ate the table scraps and survived on their instincts more than by the 'care' given to them by the humans who shared their backyards with them. No money for vets, fancy foods, treats, leads, beds and so on.



Ann's dogs were a mixed bunch from that little pup who inevitably came from Mr Smith's place because he's going '.....to drown 'em if they're still here when I get home from work.', or it just appeared at the back door or '..It followed me home...' (in my arms), always a sad story to go with the watery saucer eyes and bloated, worm infested belly.

Julia's introduction was very controlled by the elders choosing the pup from the litter of pedigree Dachshunds, always male and always named

Bruno. The new neighbours bred Golden Retrievers so now a golden ball of fluff became a constant companion of Julia. Bliss, she grew into the largest warm pillow Julia had ever had the pleasure of cuddling.

But Seamus and Max were always at home waiting to greet them with wagging tails and big lucky grins. During the day while Seamus was busy chasing the sun on the back veranda and ignoring the next door neighbour Max was busy out the front of the house, in the middle of the road slowing down the traffic (and making the police's radar useless) until the sun's warmth left the bitumen when he would return to Seamus and they would wait together for A n J to come home.

By this time the dogs' diet had been upgraded to specialty pet food, fresh meat, bones, biscuits and those magical treats. Scraps were usually veggies and gravy, mmm mmmmm. The library now held shelves of books, videos and magazines on dog behaviour, management, psychology and diet etc etc. We were getting help from all over the world. Soon we were introduced to dog specific sports and activities, interests and causes.

By this time the hardest decision of all, any pet owner has to make, had to be made about Seamus. He had a peaceful passing to the Rainbow Bridge where he would meet all those

Daschunds, a Golden Retriever and a myriad of x breeds. This did not ease the deeply saddened hearts that now only had Max to comfort them.

But life goes on and so did their love for dogs. Out of the blue they spotted a shiny black x Rottweiler puppy. Their hearts were stolen by this little fellow who had been overlooked for weeks. Not any longer. He, Banjo was whisked into their arms and taken to be with Max where he would learn the way of how to train your humans from an expert! He was a magical dog. His ball skills are infamous. He played soccer in Lightning Ridge during the floods and entertained and amused humans from the beaches of NSW and Queensland to the Capertee Valley and beyond. He could catch a ball on the full even when he already had two balls in his mouth!!!!



The library continues to grow as does their knowledge. They are about to be introduced to the world of obedience, agility and Dog Club.



For some unknown reason they are driving down the road to Katoomba's RSPCA one afternoon. This was the beginning of a black and tiny slashes of white xBorder Collie to be known as Jeremiah. Banjo and Max are going to love him. The tales of Jeremiah would rival 'War and Peace'. Suffice it to say that this little dog touched the heart of all he met and to this day his influence is still opening doors. Jeremiah lived but three short years and in that time he gave more than could be imagined. Today his influence is still being felt. His death was devastating for A n J. Although his journey to the Rainbow Bridge took a part of their hearts and souls his death gave me a second chance at life.

I will be forever grateful to him. My age is unknown, vets guessed at between 1 and 5 years. A n J are convinced I grew a little in height after I came to them so they say I was around one when they got me. My second life began when Julie Gray saved me from the streets of Wollongong that I had been wandering ever since my humans disappeared. The streets were my home for how long I have no idea and nor do I wish to know or remember. Julie took me to a vet where she made sure I was given all that was necessary to bring me back from the brink.



I was 10kg. My mind was closed down. I lived in another dimension. I was unaware of my surroundings except that it was the back of a stranger's car which had had many dogs in it before me. Their scent told many stories but none that I could read. A warm gentle hand entered the car and stroked my head and rubbed my ears. I rubbed my muzzle along the soft warm arm. Words passed my ears but they were fuzzy and muffled.

I am walking beside these legs. We meet a black and tan dog he licks me and wags his tail. I feel a peace I have not known forever. I look up and see two sets of human eyes and one dog's. In an instant our eyes meet and my mind tells me I will live again, feel love again and eventually play again. I curl up in the story filled car and dream of what an hour ago I would never have believed possible.

Two days pass and once again I meet the wagging tail dog and those eyes that make me feel hope. Another dog is there too. He is small but old and wise. He talks with me and gives me reassurances that I will be happy here.

Ten years have passed since then and during that time I have met top trainers from England, (one of whom said I was 'completely shut down and would never learn a thing'), judges, instructors, breeders and more dogs than I ever imagined existed and some of the loveliest dog people ever.

I am Jemmie Sir Echo. I am A n J's first purebred dog and their first BC. I have, since becoming part of their family had the privilege to welcome another rescue dog,



Abydos Clicker Queen into the fold when she was but a wee pup. Mind you, I didn't know what she was then really, it was a couple of months before I realized she was actually a dog!. A x Kelpie x German Shepherd x Honorary BC. Abby taught me to play again and to chase and to run.

Also we have Lunar Rose Eclipse, a gorgeous red BC with the most magnificent tail.




She has taught me class and style. She comes from Queensland but her dad is an old mate from Dog Club. We really would like a Chocolate and a Tri and a Merle and and and but – we have to share and can't have all the dogs ourselves, so I am told.

People are a strange breed. I keep meeting the Best of Breed but also the Worst of Breed. I have sad thoughts at times when my pre A n J memories haunt me. But the saddest thing is, these memories are still reality for many dogs out there. Please help to stop the cruelty to all creatures in your part of the world. Whether it be in the next door neighbour's yard, trialling or show ring, local pet shop, park, street or shopping centre. If we all do a little bit it will make a BIG difference.

I hope you enjoyed my life story and you will be at our 60th Anniversary Show in October. Remember to love all your dogs and talk to them every day. We really are the best therapy when life gets over the top. Take a holiday at 'pet friendly' places, by the beach or lake or on the farm. Remember wherever you go with me – take some pooh bags and pick up after me. We have to educate non dog people that we are the best companions, even if we do have a toileting problem.


