Show Manager's Report: No manager. Breed ring for Oct show to be set up on the day, by Lauren and Ann. All early helpers to meet at grounds at 7.00am.

Show Secretary's Report: Re Dogs NSW levy – as it appears to impact on this Show and Trial – moved to General Business. Stewards organised. Photographer is PoochnPix, L Somers to follow up. Catering for officials and exhibitors is organised, numbers to be advised. Judges accommodation and travel organised. Breed Judge arriving Friday evening, to take a taxi to hotel and the Club reimburse.

Obedience Trial Manager: The manager, Julie Cole, and Ann Moy to set up obedience rings on the day.

Agility Trial Manager: Wayne Baxter will look after Agility. All agility competitors will help. Sue Fed to scribe, Cecil Baxter to be steward and town crier, Andrew Baxter to be timekeeper.

Herding Report: Judges for upcoming trial are Tull Luttrell and Tracey Lamb. Their transport and accommodation are organised. Entries have just started coming in – lower than earlier as a lot of dogs are now above testing level. Need a rep for the trial.

Tracking Report: Nil.

Trophy Steward: Trophies have been purchased for the October show. Some of these were bought at the trade fair at a very reasonable price. Others are specially made for our BCC. There is one bill to be paid to me tonight and that is the main costings over and done with.

There are two outstanding invoices for Richmond trophies. I will hand these over to Brett tonight.

There are a couple of things that still need to be purchased, however some of the gifts have been made up of leftover stock and have therefore been sourced very cheaply.

Are we having junior handler and do we have any idea how many we will need?

The cake plate ordered at the last meeting is in the kiln as we speak.

I went to a new ribbon manufacturer and got given a good price I was unsure of them having the order ready on time but made an informed decision and decided to order through them. They have given me no reply and as I have no way to confirm the order, I have played it safe and gone with the old supplier. The new supplier, I hope will give me an answer for the next show and I will get the order in early with them for the April show. If I had waited I was relying on the order done and finalized in 5 days. (I did not want to see Brett injured, as he promised to take the kick up the backside for me if it failed).

Treasurer to pay Richmond Trophies – was waiting on invoices. Re new ribbon manufacturer – will write to him and explain the situation. Majority of trophies for upcoming show cost \$604 – excellent value

Publicity: Nil.

National Breed Council Reps: Brett to write to the other delegates and confirm Hereditary Diseases reps, also to draw attention to the Draft Survey sent by NSW to NBCC and all Clubs. Will check if the Draft survey should be worked on by the NBCC Hereditary Diseases reps.

Hereditary Diseases Committee Report: According to the Minutes of the ANKC National Breed Council Conference of 25 August, the Draft Survey we received from Mr R Maver is now obsolete, and the ANKC Canine Health Committee is waiting on a new draft from the National Border Collie Council.

Meeting decided: Secretary to write to NBCC Secretary and ask NBCC Secretary request confirmation from the ANKC re this. Also ask NBCC Secretary to advise ANKC that a new Draft Survey will be submitted.

BCCQld has the old survey on their website. Secretary to write to Qld re this as it is no longer applicable, and cc NBCC.

We have sent a proposed Draft Survey to the NBCC and all the BC Clubs in Australia. We are waiting for feedback on it. The Draft Survey is to be published in October Bordertales, and comments/suggestions requested.

General Business:

New badges etc have been delivered. Meeting decided prices to be \$6 for plain badge, \$7 for the rest, ie tie bars, book marks, show clips.

Committee Meeting for Tuesday 6 November – Melbourne cup Day, to be moved to Tuesday 13 November.

Re Dogs Nsw Levy – meeting discussed and all were concerned at the additional impost, and in particular its effect on our upcoming show, as it was not advertised at the time we set entry fees.

That the NSW BCC secretary write to Dogs NSW expressing the club's concerns about the recent increase to the Show Levy based on two points of view. Firstly from the club's perspective, the increase in the levy was introduced after the club had advertised our show and trial and the increase to the levy will mean that the club will have to absorb the cost of the levy without an opportunity of passing this increase onto the exhibitors. Secondly, from our members' perspective the increase to the levy will hit the performance events such as agility, obedience and herding where it is possible for a dog to be entered in more than one class on a day and Border Collies make up a large percentage of the exhibitors competing in these events.

IMPORTANT NOTICES...

WE NEED YOUR HELP

The following suggested **Breed Draft Survey** has been compiled by the hereditary diseases sub-committee of the BCC of NSW. With input from other members of the BCC of NSW and a few breeders from other clubs we have come up with the following suggested draft.

We invite input from breeders around the country to find out if we are all on the same wavelength in regard to litter restrictions and DNA testing. A breed survey conducted by the ANKC is a long and complex procedure so the closer we can get to agreement before the draft is even voted on by the breed clubs, the easier the whole process will be.

As a breed we already have one of the highest compliance rates of DNA testing of any breed worldwide. We are trailblazers in this regard and breeders of other breeds look to us to set an example. Border Collie breeders are generally very well educated in the use of genetic testing so we now need to decide on the next step we will take. As most dedicated breeders are already DNA testing it is time to pull the puppy farmers into line by making them comply with reasonable testing. We do need to be careful to make sure that any rules we agree on will be adhered to by breeders without doing any harm to the breed.

Ask yourself the following questions:

- Is this what I am already doing in my breeding program?
- Will any of the suggested rules make future breeding impossible for me?
- How much testing am I prepared to do to possibly only breed from an animal once?
Testing for all three conditions plus hip and elbow scoring adds up to a lot of money but at least you know exactly where you stand.
- Are the suggested restrictions sufficient to prevent any cases of the three conditions?
- Do you want to have the rules the same for all three conditions? There are many more TNS and CEA carriers than there are CL carriers and CEA is not usually fatal.
- If you would like different rules for each problem what would you change?
- Is there anything you would change or clarify to make you more likely to vote in favour of any or all of the proposal?

Border Collie Draft Survey

DNA tests are now available to determine the genotype (Normal, Carrier or Affected) of Border Collies for the two fatal conditions Neuronal Ceroid Lipofucinos (CL), & Trapped Neutrophil Syndrome (TNS) and also the usually non-fatal eye affliction, Collie Eye Anomaly (CEA). These three conditions are all inherited as autosomal recessive traits, and in each case both parents have to be Carriers or Affected to produce affected offspring. Most concerned breeders are already testing breeding stock to ensure that no more Border Collies will ever be affected by CL, TNS or CEA.

There is absolutely no reason to eliminate any animals carrying any of these three conditions from the gene pool, now or in the future. The whole point of using these tests is to preserve all bloodlines while ensuring puppies are not affected by these conditions. Preservation of a diverse gene pool is imperative to avoid increasing the risk of other genetic problems occurring within the breed. We now have the means to completely control CL, TNS and CEA and prevent any puppies being affected by them. On the other hand, we have no control over other health problems that may possibly have a genetic cause and are known to occur sporadically within the breed.

Narrowing the gene pool will increase the incidence of conditions including epilepsy, PDA heart defects, thyroid problems, undescended testicles, glaucoma, HD, OCD and various auto immune disorders that have been identified but are not yet considered "breed problems". Not to mention the genetic problems we don't even know about yet.

One of the reasons we have so many TNS carriers in the breed now is the fact that CL carriers had to be avoided for 20 years before the DNA test was developed, as this was our only means of reducing the incidence of CL. This narrowed the gene pool to the state we are now in, with so many Border Collies descended from just a few animals who were believed to be Normal for CL. These same animals we now know were often Normal for CL, but unfortunately many were carrying TNS. The TNS gene goes back to the origins of the breed as it occurs in ISDS lines as well as show lines, but the avoidance of CL carriers has greatly increased the number of TNS carriers.

The Genotype for each condition may be determined by DNA testing or by parentage. All progeny from a DNA Normal to Normal mating have to be DNA Normal. To be declared Normal by parentage for any of the three conditions, the DNA genotype Normal of the parents will have to be recorded on the ANKC database and this facility will be available from 1 January 2008. Official results submitted to the database will only be accepted where the DNA sample sent for testing is from a microchipped animal and was taken and identified by an authorised collector (eg: vet, breed club official). Further DNA testing to determine parentage will not be required but breeders are reminded that a litter registration application is a legal document.

DNA testing for CL & CEA first became available in 2005 but not all dogs were microchipped at this time. Many Border Collies including some that have stored frozen semen have DNA test results for CL & TNS from samples submitted before microchipping was routine. To allow for the use of these animals or semen without "official" results we have set the date requiring official results to be for all animals born after 1 January 2005.

To ensure that all breeders adhere to responsible breeding guidelines the NBCC request that the ANKC conduct a breed survey of all registered owners of Border Collies asking the following questions. Each question is to be voted on separately.

- (1) That for litters born from **1 January 2009** the following litter registration restrictions apply in relation to **CL**.
 - At least one parent of every litter must be DNA Normal for CL by testing or by parentage.
 - No CL DNA Affected animals are to be bred from.

- Acceptable matings for CL are DNA Normal/Normal or Normal/Carrier where both parents are born after 1 January 2005.
 - Animals born before 1 January 2005 need not have official test results provided they are only bred to a DNA Normal partner. This will allow for the use of older animals that may not have been microchipped when samples were taken for testing and the indefinite use of valuable frozen semen that has been stored to protect the future of the breed.
- (2) That for litters born from **1 January 2009** the following litter registration restrictions apply in relation to **TNS**.
- At least one parent of every litter must be Normal for TNS by testing or by parentage.
 - No TNS DNA Affected animals are to be bred from.
 - Acceptable matings for TNS are DNA Normal/Normal or Normal/Carrier where both parents are born after 1 January 2005.

 - Animals born before 1 January 2005 need not have official test results provided they are only bred to a DNA Normal partner. This will allow for the use of older animals that may not have been microchipped when samples were taken for testing and the indefinite use of valuable frozen semen that has been stored to protect the future of the breed.

CL

For litters born from 1st November 2005 both parents must be DNA typed for CL.

Permitted matings will be: CLEAR / CLEAR
 CLEAR / CARRIER

The old rules about not mating animals under 2 years and carriers on the pedigree will no longer apply were DNA results are provided. Litters may be listed under either the new rules or the old rules until 1st November 2005.

CEA

For litters born from 1st January 2006 at least one parent must be DNA Clear for CEA. Permitted matings will be:
